About PQA

PQA, the Pharmacy Quality Alliance, is a national quality organization dedicated to improving medication safety, adherence, and appropriate use. A measure developer, researcher, educator and convener, PQA's quality initiatives support better medication use and high-quality care.

A non-profit, non-governmental organization, PQA represents the spectrum of healthcare leaders involved in prescription drug coverage, medication use, medication services and quality improvement. Nearly 220 diverse member organizations, including pharmacies, health plans, health care providers, pharmacy benefit managers, biopharmaceutical companies, technology vendors, government agencies, associations, health information technology organizations, researchers, accrediting organizations and academia. PQA's work is patient-centered and includes participation from individuals with relevant lived experience.

PQA was established in 2006 as a public-private partnership with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). PQA was created because there were no organizations or national programs focused on quality improvement for prescription drug programs. PQA develops medication- focused performance measures through a consensus-based, multistakeholder process.



Executive Fellowship

The Executive Fellow must hold a doctoral degree (PharmD, MD or PhD) within the United States (or plan to secure a doctoral degree within six months) from an accredited program. Incoming fellows are required to sit for licensure exam(s) and complete all other professional licensing requirements either prior to beginning the fellowship but no later than August 31 of the fellowship year.

PQA seeks individuals with the following attributes:

Commitment to improving the quality of medication use

Strong work ethic

Ability to work independently and in a collaborative environment

Strong writing and public speaking skills

Ability to effectively manage multiple projects concurrently

Availability for virtual and onsite interviews is required. Select candidates will be offered an onsite interview scheduled for early-mid January. Onsite interview travel expenses will be offset by a modest stipend.



MPH Practicum Program

PQA offers supervised applied practice experience opportunities to Master of Public Health (MPH) students seeking to fulfill their school's MPH graduating requirements. Working from a national platform in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, or remotely, practicum students are immersed in the healthcare quality landscape with a focus on appropriate medication use, health equity, and patient experience.

The program aims to foster the development of skills in one or more of the following areas to support PQA's mission to advance the quality of medication use:

Quality Measurement

Health Services Research and Policy Evaluation

Communications

Stakeholder Engagement

Each practicum offering is tailored to meet the goals and objectives of the student's graduate program while aligning with PQA's current initiatives, and will also include the following:

- Earning PQA's Medication Use Quality Certificate
- Engaging in professional development activities
- Delivering a final presentation to the PQA team

The PQA Summer MPH Practicum Program is a paid applied practice experience opportunity.

Transportation, housing, and all other living costs are the responsibility of the graduate participant.



MPH Practicum Program

Students will have the opportunity to contribute to ongoing activities that support PQA's mission, such as:

Conducting literature reviews

Facilitating informational interviews

Interpreting results of data analysis

Developing dissemination and communication strategies and products

Addressing health disparities through integration of pharmacy and public health perspectives

1. Assess eligibility


- Students actively enrolled in a CEPH-accredited MPH program during the practicum period

Summer Executive Internship

Executive interns participate in an 8- to 12-week summer program that takes place in person at PQA headquarters located in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area or remotely. Selected students may complete a rotation at PQA headquarters located in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, or remotely. The rotation is available as a final-year elective to pharmacy students completing their Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences.

How to Apply

1. Assess eligibility

Internship:

 Students actively enrolled in a healthcare-related undergraduate or graduate program or have a relevant degree or study concentration, such as health policy or communications

APPE:

 Final-year elective to pharmacy students completing their Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences

2. Submit Required Materials

Candidates are required to submit the following materials through an online application platform for both the <u>Summer Executive Internship</u> and <u>APPE</u> accessible via the PQA website:

- One page cover letter and curriculum vitae
- Unofficial transcript from an academic institution
- One letter of recommendation
- APPE Candidates Only: Letter of approval from school or college's experiential program staff expressing permission to complete PQA's elective rotation
